## Live bands were music to the ears of venue's founder Nabers bar, restaurant grows from small-town roots

It's that sort of atmosphere that Nenaber has created at Nabers, the restaurant/bar/live music venue he and his wife Pam opened at west Chandler's upscale Casa Paloma shopping center a year ago this month.

“When I was a little kid I’d always hang around the restaurant and bowling alley,” Nenaber recalls, “so it’s in my blood.”

Redfield couldn’t hold Nenaber, however. He moved to Tempe in 1965—Jan. 16 of that year, he precisely notes—and has lived there, more or less, ever since.

He graduated from ASU’s College of Business, focusing his studies on insurance, and went on to be president and CEO of Mesa Underwriters Specialty Insurance Company, a property and casualty company (its acronym, perhaps prophetically, is MUSIC).

His wife Pam, also an ASU grad with a Masters in Hospital Administration, is CEO of pharmaceutical operations at Banner Health.

So, after all of this achievement, what would the Nenabers do for an encore? Dick had an idea, one that was connected to his childhood memories of his Mom’s and Dad’s business.

“I love live music,” he says. “And the opportunities to hear it, at least the kind I like, were hard to come by around here.”

The kind of music Nenaber likes is rock-and-roll and country-western of a certain vintage—The Doobie Brothers and The Eagles in the former genre, George Strait and Alan Jackson in the latter.

To provide a suitable venue for live acts in this style, the Nenabers opened Nabers, a club with a

sprawling, barnlike interior, well equipped with TV screens—we watched a Diamondbacks game on a recent visit—but centering on a fine stage between twin bars.

Local acts such as Furious George and Elvis Before Noon have played it. For a more relaxing outing, Nabers features acoustic music on Wednesday and Thursday evenings.

But an important accompaniment to music is food, and that hasn’t been overlooked on the menu of Nabers’ twice-weekly music night.

On that recent visit I devoured the “Big Bohemoth Burger,” and my family and I enjoyed a superb bread pudding topped with chocolate and caramel—you’ll want at least three hearty appetites for that one, by the way.

Says Nenaber of the from-scratch menu:

“We’re locally owned, and we try to serve food as fresh as possible. But we also try to intrigue you with our flavors, and the twist we put on it.”

Yummy indeed, but the No. 1 motivation behind Nabers is its emphasis on music.

And who knows what sort of acts might turn up there—despite the country/rock focus of Nabers, Dick Nenaber’s fondness for a good tune isn’t limited.

“In all honesty, I like Irish music,” he says.

“I just like music, I guess. I can’t carry a tune in a bucket, but I think musicians have a gift from God.”

# Herculean effort extended to remove monsoon debris

*More storms could compound problem in Tempe, W. Chandler neighborhoods*

The city of Tempe continues its efforts helping residents clean up in the aftermath of the monsoon storm, which brought heavy rains and powerful winds that uprooted trees, downed limbs and left some residents with lots of yard debris.

Tempe has collected nearly 700 tons of vegetation since the July 13 storm – outside of the city’s regular

bulk and green-waste collection schedule.

This material is being diverted from the landfill and will eventually be turned into compost.

To put this into perspective, a typical city-wide bulk green collection month will average about 280 tons.

The regular bulk trash schedule is also still in effect.

The process is taking longer than initially expected due to the severity of the storm, which brought down a significant number of mature trees and associated debris.

City crews began the cleanup process immediately after the storm, working around the clock to clear trees, limbs and debris from streets.

Tempe is focusing efforts on the areas hit hardest by the storm – south of Elliot Road between Kyrene Road and the Price/101 Loop.

To help expedite the cleanup process and pace, residents have been asked to cut yard material into sections no longer than six feet and place it adjacent to their property (without




# \$1 million grant will aid research So. Tempe prof named for online studies of earth's past, future

South Tempe resident and ASU biogeochemist Ariel Anbar has been selected as a Howard Hughes Medical Institute professor, an appointment that brings with it a five-year, \$1 million grant to support research and educational activities.

"There were nearly 175 applicants, and during the process it was difficult to tell which ones they liked," Anbar said. "When I received notice, I was very excited because we all knew at the end of the day that it was a coin toss."

The award, which recognizes a career marked by pioneering research and teaching, was meted out to only 15 among dozens of U.S. applicants from 13 universities.

Since the inception of the HHMI Professor program in 2002, and including the new group of 2014 professors, only 55 scientists have been recognized. These professors are accomplished research scientists who are working to change undergraduate science education in the United States.

"Exceptional teachers have a lasting impact on students," said HHMI President Robert Tjian.

"These scientists are at the top of their respective fields and they bring the same creativity and rigor to science education that they bring to their research."

Anbar is a professor in ASU's School of Earth and Space Exploration and the Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry in the College of Liberal Art and Sciences.

He also is a Distinguished Sustainability Scientist in the Global Institute of Sustainability and was named an ASU President's Professor in 2013 in recognition of his pioneering online education efforts.

Anbar is deeply involved in using the medium to its fullest to help educate and encourage a generation that has grown up with the Internet.

"When I first began teaching at ASU back in 2004, I wanted to teach a large lecture class. By the end, I wasn't really impressed by the experience of only being able to reach a small percentage of the class," Anbar said.

"Even the best lecturer you may remember but not the lectures themselves. I realized how efficient video games have become at grabbing and sustaining people's attention, so I thought to myself, why not incorporate the same approach with teaching science?" A leading geoscientist with more than 100 peer-reviewed papers to his name, Anbar's research focuses on Earth's past and future as a habitable planet.

This expertise feeds directly into his teaching in the highly successful class *Habitable Worlds*,

developed through ASU Online.

In *Habitable Worlds*, Anbar and course designer Lev Horodyskyj combine the power of the Internet, game-inspired elements, and the sensibilities of a tech-savvy generation to teach what makes planets habitable and engage students in a simulated hunt for other habitable worlds in the cosmos.

This innovative online course kindles student interest and learning. Beginning in fall 2014, it will be available outside of ASU as *HabWorlds Beyond* ([www.habworlds.org](http://www.habworlds.org)), via a partnership with education technology company Smart Sparrow.

*Habitable Worlds* has been taken by more than 1,500 ASU students and consistently receives outstanding student reviews.

"Through my experiences I have found that you can engage in many more interactions than in a traditional lecture class," Anbar said. "With online, I've found that if you give it more time, it can create a lasting impact and you can see what the students are actually thinking. Some will even write things that they would have not said otherwise. Responding to the student's needs almost takes them by surprise, it's very powerful."

The HHMI grant will enable Anbar to develop a suite of online virtual field trips that teach the story of Earth's evolution as an inhabited world. The

Those who are lucky enough to be of Scottish descent know that the folds in a kilt are *always* folds of honor.

So it makes perfect sense that Tempe's own Tilted Kilt would participate, and make a fine showing, in the recently completed Folds of Honor "Here's to Heroes" fundraiser.

The Folds of Honor Foundation, on a more serious note, is a charity launched in 2007 by an Oklahoma Air National Guard veteran and professional golfer named Dan Rooney to provide scholarships and other assistance to the families of servicemen and servicewomen killed or disabled in Iraq or Afghanistan.



## New year ignites athletes' new hopes

School is back as of Aug. 4, which marks the beginning of the 2014-15 sports season for local high school athletes hoping this year to not only help their team's performance improve but their own individual achievement over last season.

Corona's cross country team can only strive to repeat last season's results, while most of the other fall sports teams have room for improvement over their 2013 results.

**Corona Cross Country** — Corona's boys cross country team had a tremendous 2013 season, going undefeated and winning the Division I Arizona State Championships on Nov. 9 at Cave Creek Golf Course.

It was only the second time in the school's history that the boys team had won the cross country championship. The first was in 1992.

The win was a team effort, with the Aztec's top runners, **Nate Rodriguez, Ryan Normand** and **Marcus Wheeler** crossing the finish line 1-2-3. But

it was Corona's other two runners, **Patrick Cullings** and **Blake Fischer**, who sealed the win when they chased down and beat Desert Vista's fourth runner. Corona's other two runners were **Slade Sumners** and **Andrew Truswell**.

The Aztecs defeated their next closest competitor, Desert Vista, by 32 points after tallying only 48 points to the Thunder's 80.

Corona should return Wheeler, now a senior, and Sumners, only a sophomore, to help defend its state championship.

Corona's girls team had a better season in 2013 than their fifth place finish at state behind Desert Vista, Xavier, Mountain View and Highland would suggest.

For instance, the Lady Aztecs took third for the second year in a row at the prestigious Doug Conley Invite, with top runner **Kelly Naumann** finishing in fourth place. Naumann improved steadily over the season to finish fourth at state as well—the highest finish for an individual Corona runner in school history.

Other runners contributing to the fifth place at state were **Mason Swenson, Renee Clary, Grace Ashu** and **Sammie Moore. Mackenzie Harder** and **Kristina Nedlekofa** competed for



## Tempe's 'Commitment to Schools' enterprise Group works to lift Arizona's 46th-place ranking for kids' wellbeing

For the past 16 years, Tempe youth have had a friend in Lynette Stonefeld and the program she manages, "Commitment to Schools."

"We serve more than 6,000 kids and their families in the Tempe Union, Tempe Elementary and Kyrene school districts by collaborating with leaders in education, business, social service, and government," said Stonefeld.

The mission of Commitment to Schools (C2S) is to surround students with a community of support and to empower them to stay in school and to achieve in life, explains Stonefeld.

"C2S serves as a broker of services to local public schools. We assist with identifying the needs of individual schools and locate existing community resources to help address those needs.

"This is accomplished by working to achieve several objectives: we ensure that students have access to basic needs, such as food, clothing and school supplies; we engage parents so that they know how to support their children's education; and we encourage community partners to participate and to become advocates for children."

Operating under the umbrella of the Tempe Community Council, which is a 501c3 organization, C2S coordinates community resources at the school site, or in an accessible location.

Their services include coordinating "Thrive to Five," which promotes school readiness from birth

to kindergarten; family resource centers that assist students in kindergarten through fifth grade; and "Threadz," which is a resource center for teens at Tempe High School and Compadre North, says Stonefeld.

"Our dedicated board members represent all sectors of the community. They are committed to assuring that a full range of medical, social, recreational, and educational services are available as identified through our school and community partnerships.

"We are funded through SRP, AVENT, Cox Charities and the state of Arizona, along with individual contributions." Some recent accomplishments of C2S over the last school year include:

- Hosted 352 classes for parents and caregivers and attended by more than 2,900 adults;
- Distributed free clothing, shoes, personal items, and school supplies to more than 700 youth at the Teen Resource Center;
- Provided mental health services to 408 high school students by C2S-funded prevention counselors;
- Assisted 278 families to apply for state health programs;
- Distributed more than 400 backpacks to low-income students;
- And, coordinated more than 87 free eye exams and eyeglasses for low-income students.

The need for the services provided by C2S continues to grow, which is no surprise when considering the results of the most recent "Kids Count" indicators of the well being of families across the nation. Compiled annually by the Annie E. Casey Foundation, the Kids Count report ranks each state according to economic and educational measurements.

The 2014 Kids Count report lists the wellbeing of children in Arizona as being 46th in the nation, with 50 being the lowest rank.

The data is delivered to politicians, elected officials and government staff to use in developing policy positions that improve the conditions for children in the state.

"We continue to see that families in Arizona lack secure and full employment," said Stonefeld, "which is a contributing factor in the number of children living in poverty in the state.

According to Kids Count data, 27 percent of Arizona's youth live in poverty.

It's the on-going challenge to prepare all Tempe youth to learn and to perform well at schools that continues to motivate Stonefeld.

"While many people look at Tempe as a very middle-class community, we do have struggling families living here."

# Strategies to help ease students' back-to-school concerns

## Counselors a good resource for anxiety, bullying, social woes

It's the exciting start of another school year, and while most students and parents are looking forward to new activities, teachers and friends, many are also experiencing anxiety and fears.

Students are wondering:

What is my teacher going to be like? Will I do well in classes? Will I have friends to play with at recess or sit with at lunch? Will I be able to find my classroom and learn my way around campus?

Parents are concerned how their child's individual needs will be met, how they will manage new expectations and course work, or how important homework will be.

Teachers have been preparing for weeks — completing advanced classes and professional development, setting up their classrooms, meeting with principals and colleagues, assembling learning materials, and preparing lessons. Teachers are looking forward to meeting new students and hoping parents will trust in them as professional educators.

Whether a student is starting kindergarten, transitioning to middle school or high school, or is off to college, experiencing anxiety related to change is a common challenge.

Anytime there is a change of routine and new faces, it tends to create a sense of anxiety and fear, says Bre Moro, from the Wellness Council of Arizona and the new employee health coach in the Kyrene

School District.

Moro says that ensuring families attend their school's Meet the Teacher night is especially important to help ease start of the school year fears and anxiety.

For students, this is an opportunity to meet their new teacher and become familiar with their campus and schedules prior to the first day of school.

Parents have the opportunity to connect with the teachers, and with other parents, either individually or through parent organizations.

At Meet the Teacher nights, parents and students can get a better understanding of teacher expectations and what is planned for the school year ahead, easing anxiety and increasing confidence.

Learning the layout of campus, which door to enter for the cafeteria, the location of the office, restrooms, gym, and where to line up for the bus, park your bicycle, or where to go for parent drop off and pick up areas are all adjustments. Reviewing new class schedules, bus schedules, school menus, and activities information, and being prepared with all the right school supplies help students understand new procedures and routines.

Strategies for managing new experiences and change can make the difference in whether students are motivated and independent or struggle.

Retired longtime middle school counselor Marsha Ridings offers some great advice for parents

in suggesting parents encourage their child to be problem-solvers when starting the new school year. Instead of telling them everything they need to know, show them where they can get the information, encourage them ask questions to find out what they need to know, help them develop the skill to advocate and think for themselves.

Parents often want to protect their child (from preschool to college) from making mistakes or feeling uncomfortable, but Ridings reminds parents that always being there to ask the questions or address concerns will take away a child's confidence and ability to learn how to find good information and problem-solve on their own.

When parents see their child is struggling or having a bad day, they can reassure their child they are listening and care, but build the child's confidence and problem-solving skills by asking their child questions such as, "What do you think you could do to make the situation better?" or "Who could you ask to get more information?", and encouraging their child to ask themselves, "How can I solve this?"

The school counselor is a great resource that can help discuss feelings of anxiety, bullying, and social skills.

Moro encourages parents to get their child excited about school and always make sure they have a good breakfast to start their day.

## New Marcos de Niza principal envisions a campus where kindness, respect are valued

As the newly appointed principal of Marcos de Niza High School, Sean McDonald will implement his "blue-gate theory when school begins on Aug. 4.

"When students walk through the school doors, I want each of them to feel they are entering a safe and friendly environment," said McDonald.

He favors a relationship-based model so that no student drops through the cracks. If a student needs additional support, it should be identified early.

"By staying in touch with students and individually monitoring their progress, we can make sure that they are meeting their personal benchmarks," said McDonald.

His plan is to have the student body and teachers exhibit kindness and respect to one another, but also to ensure that students understand that they are in a culture with expectations of accomplishment.

"I want students to be successful at Marcos and

## New start, end times coming to Kyrene elementary, middle schools

*Governing board decision seen as beneficial to many area families*

**W**hen the 2014-15 school year begins on Aug. 4, students at nine schools in the Kyrene district will have a new start and ending time in a change to keep all schools on the same schedule.

The start time at all middle schools now will be 8:30 a.m., with an ending time of 3:30 p.m.

The six middle schools moving to this schedule include Kyrene Akimel A-al, Kyrene del Pueblo, Kyrene Middle School, Kyrene Centennial, Kyrene Aprende and Kyrene Altadena.

The start time at all elementary schools now will be 7:45 a.m. with an ending time of 2:35 p.m.

The three elementary schools changing to this schedule include Kyrene Monte Vista, Kyrene Traditional Academy and Kyrene de las Manitas.

This will bring them in line with Kyrene's other 16 elementary schools.

After an extensive discussion by the Kyrene District Governing Board, it was agreed that modifying the start time was beneficial to most families.

"The district also conducted a series of public outreach meetings to gauge families' reaction to the change," said Nancy Dudenhofer, assistant community relations director for the Kyrene district.

"We also distributed information to 64,000 households who subscribe to our List-Serve via email to inform them of the change."

At the outreach meetings, those that disagreed with the time change had a chance to voice their concerns and to seek solutions by speaking with school administrators. In addition, parents who were not able to attend any meeting could email district staff.

The time change impacts more than re-setting the clocks—it also includes modifying transportation plans, and that will involve a fiscal impact of an estimated \$600,000 to the budget, said Jeremy Calles, chief financial officer for the Kyrene district.

"We will need to hire more bus drivers, and that will be an expense. But the trade-off is that unifying the start time for all the schools will allow our teachers to get more professional development," said Calles.

"It also benefits parents whose students are involved in athletics or after-school clubs, because an earlier start time will allow them to get home earlier, so they can still complete homework and have more family time."

The conservative budget practices of the district allowed planners to accumulate reserve funding for this change, said Calles.

"The Governing Board has made a conscious effort this year to reinvest its reserves back into the district's educational system in order to improve academic achievement, as well as parent and student satisfaction," he said.

"The change in start times will help aid that effort."

The final plan was discussed by the Governing Board/Superintendent team at the Kyrene Governing Board Study Session that aired on Tuesday,

May 27.

Time change alters some bus routes — The change in beginning and ending times for schools also altered some bus stops to create more efficient routes.

"Our top priority is to allow bus drivers to pick up and to deliver students to school in a timely manner," said Eric Nethercutt, director of facilities and transportation for Kyrene.

"These changes mainly impact middle-school bus stops, but some elementary bus stops were affected as well.

"Walking distances will increase for some students, but every effort was made to minimize any increase," he said.

If parents want to see the exact location of their child's bus stop, they can follow the instructions on the transportation page of the district website.





## Resumption of classes prompts reminders to drivers to pay special attention to kids going to, coming from school

Another school year has arrived, and motorists may experience heavier traffic in the morning and afternoon hours, reminds Sgt. Joe Favazzo, public information officer for the Chandler Police Department.

Drivers should be prepared for encounters with school buses picking up and dropping off children, as well as children walking or riding their bicycles to school.

Also, says Favazzo, keep in mind intersections around schools may be monitored by crossing guards.

Other reminders:

**Parents** — Drive your children to and from school or arrange transportation either through a carpool or school bus.

If your child is going to walk or ride their bicycle to school, walk or drive the route prior to the start of the school year.

Make sure your child knows the street names along the route. Ensure your child walks or rides the same route every day.

Point out any areas of refuge along with way, in the event your child encounters a suspicious or dangerous situation.

Areas may include a business, church, government building, or even another school. Talk to your children about the need to create distance in these encounters. Children should be taught to run away, and draw attention to themselves by yelling and screaming.

**Motorists** — Be vigilant of pedestrian traffic along the roadway. Remember the speed limit is 15 mph in school-zone crossings, and passing in these zones is prohibited. State law requires vehicle operators to stop when a school bus is picking up or dropping off children.

## Bulk trash and green waste collection to change in January

Since changing its bulk trash and green waste collection program in July 2013, Tempe has been listening to residents' feedback.

Residents said they value the city's efforts to collect and compost green organics and want more opportunities for bulk trash collection.

In June, the Tempe City Council supported modifications to the collection program to include more mixed waste (bulk trash) collections while retaining a significant green-

organics composting component.

Beginning in January, Tempe will provide six mixed waste collections per year (up from two during the last year), along with three collections for green waste (vegetation) that will be turned into nutrient-rich compost.

tournament.

From this beginning has grown an annual PGA and USGA-supported Patriot's Golf Day—in which golfers across the country are asked to add a dollar to their greens fees for the cause—and other events and fund drives designed to ease the hardships of those who have lost a parent or spouse, or whose parent or spouse has been disabled, in the wars of the last decade-plus.

## Film Fare with M.V. Moorhead

### New this week

#### *Magic in the Moonlight* —

Colin Firth plays Stanley, an English stage magician, in this latest from Woody Allen, set in the late '20s.

Stanley buries himself in the disguise of a stereotypical Chinese—he looks like Henry Brandon in *Drums of Fu Manchu*—and performs his spectacular tricks in high style, to the strains of Stravinsky or Ravel or Beethoven.

But, like many of his trade, he doesn't buy into magic in any sense beyond the

theatrical. He's a hardcore nonbeliever when it comes to the metaphysical, and he's sneeringly contemptuous of faith in any form.

Stanley is invited to the south of France to debunk Sophie, a young American clairvoyant played by Emma Stone, who has enchanted a wealthy American family there.

Sophie's manner is corny and unconvincing, but her prophecies are startling, and Stanley finds his skepticism beginning to waver.

It's a perfectly good set-up for a romantic comedy, and, as usual with Allen's

work in this mode, there's much to like in the movie. The period detail and settings are sumptuous. Firth and Stone are funny, and the supporting cast is full of capable types like Simon McBurney, Marcia Gay Harden, Jacki Weaver and Eileen Atkins, who's especially good as Stanley's doting aunt.

Also memorable, as the ukulele-strumming rich kid infatuated with Sophie, is Hamish Linklater, who seems to be flawlessly channeling the young Bradford Dillman.

But *Magic in the Moonlight* isn't quite magical. It starts off wonderfully, and for about a half hour looks like it's going to be a real gem.

And Allen does come up with some inventive flourishes. But the dialogue dithers and dawdles, and the romantic connection between Firth and Stone never becomes urgent or convincing. Allen's movies don't always come off, but I can't remember one, at least in the last 20 years or so, that was this uneconomical.

#### *Guardians of the Galaxy* —

This is the movie with the talking raccoon you've been seeing TV ads for recently. It's based on some Marvel comic series I never read, and is about a motley quintet of minor league space fugitives who band together under the rather grandiose title.

Chris Pratt, excellent in *Moneyball* and as the voice of the everyman hero of *The Lego Movie*, is the earth-born leader, a bland, less-than-brilliant ladies man with a fondness for '70s-era soul-funk-pop connected to a trauma he suffers in the

film's prologue.

Zoe Saldana is the gorgeous and much smarter green-skinned warrior-woman, and Dave Bautista is a literal-minded strongman seeking revenge.

There's a guileless ambulatory tree voiced by Vin Diesel, and Bradley Cooper is the fast-talking raccoon. There's a talking raccoon in this movie.

The villain is a standard, growling Darth Vader type.

The McGuffin they're all chasing, called "The Orb," is staggeringly uninteresting, and the long, explosion-filled climactic battle is almost—but only almost—as tedious as the similar finales in the *Thor* and *Iron Man* movies and *The Avengers* and *Captain America: The Winter Soldier* and the other superhero flicks of recent years.

But I still found *Guardians of the Galaxy*, co-written and directed by the gifted James Gunn, very entertaining, because of its central joke:

The unassuming, colloquial manner of these characters against the backdrop of all this cosmic bombast.

It would be hard for me to dislike any movie in which the hero dances to "Come and Get Your Love" on the surface of a distant planet under the opening credits.

Or, for that matter, a movie with a talking raccoon.

Did I mention that this movie has a talking raccoon?

*Guardians* is playing Valleywide; *Moonlight* is at Harkins Camelview.



Corona as well.

Corona's coaches have high hopes for the 2014 season because they should return seniors Naumann and Nedlekofa, junior Harder and sophomore Clary plus a number of very good young runners.

**McClintock Boys Cross Country** — The Chargers' team in 2013 had a fast junior runner, **Emmanuel Hidalgo**, who finished fourth at the Division II State Cross Country Championships held in November at Cave Creek Golf Course. Hidalgo led the young team with only one senior, **David Morley**, as well as juniors **Michael Rojas** and **Ethan Clay**, sophomore **Guillermo Morales**, freshman **Christian Wiltbank** and **Abraham Lee** to a 14th place finish. McClintock should have no problem finishing higher this season with the return of Hidalgo, Morales, Wiltbank and Clay.

**Marcos de Niza football** — It could be an interesting season for Marcos de Niza football players and their fans to not see the familiar figure of former head coach **Roy Lopez** during practice and on the sidelines Friday nights.

Lopez, who coached the Padres for 19 years and had been the head coach since 2003, resigned in December after being placed on administrative leave just before the first round of the Division II playoffs.

Lopez, with an 88-32 record while at Marcos had been successful getting the Padres deep in the post season the past few years. He was well liked by both the players and fans. Lopez may well be remembered best for getting the Padres into the championship game in 2012 when the team had a 12-2 record. Hopefully the team will continue to flourish under new head coach **Sean Morin**, the team's

former offensive coordinator. Morin was able to coach last season's team as far as the quarterfinals before the Padres eventually lost to Chaparral.

**Corona Football** — After starting the 2013 season 0-6 and losing yet another head coach, Corona's football team rallied behind interim head coach **Tim Kelly** to win three out of their last four games left in the season.

The highlight of the season was probably when the Aztecs defeated arch-rival Desert Vista 41-28 on Oct. 24, in front of Corona's home crowd.

The Aztecs' 39-player squad appeared to get some of their swagger and pride back after defeating the Thunder's 69-player squad that evening.

Corona fans and current players are hopeful that the feeling of those three last wins will carry over to the 2014 season, when the Aztecs will have a clean slate under former assistant and current head coach **Cory Nenaber**.

**Tempe Football** — The Buffaloes had a great 2013 regular season, entering the Division II playoffs at 9-1, before losing in the first round to Sabino 49-56.

The good news for Tempe football players and fans in 2014 is that quarterback **Emanuel Gant** will be playing. The bad news is that Gant, who has shown massive improvements in his stats over the past three years, will be graduating in 2015.

The year before Gant joined the team his freshman year, the Buffaloes were 0-10. During Gant's freshman year, the team improved to only 9-1 but Gant threw the ball over 100 yards per game, threw for seven touchdowns and ran for two.

In Gant's sophomore year the team improved to 6-4, while he passed for close to 300 yards a game, threw 24 touchdowns and rushed for five.

In 2013, the team improved to 9-2 while Gant threw 42 touchdowns and close to 350 yards a game.

The 2014 roster has 13 seniors and seven juniors, which could suggest this year's team gained playoff experience

last season that will bode well for their success in 2014.

The Buffaloes are predicted to play well against their first five opponents before meeting Washington Oct. 2. Washington was the only team Tempe lost to in the regular season last year.

It is also rumored that Tempe's head coach Brian Walker is most worried about the Buffaloes' game against Maricopa, Corona's current coach Nenaber's old team.

**Corona Swim and Dive** — The Aztecs should be looking to improve over the 2013 season, when only six girls and two boys qualified to swim or dive in the Division I state meet.

The good news is that the girls team saw marked improvement over the year before, when they finished 15th at state or seven places higher than they had in 2012.

**Karilyn Quon**, who will be a junior this fall, was involved in earning most of the points for the girls team last season at the state meet. Quon was third in the 200 Yard IM and eighth in the 500 Yard Freestyle.

Quon also swam in the 200 Freestyle Relay on Corona's team at state with **Erick Boeger**, **Amy Hong** and **Tessa Martinson**, and on the 200 Yard Medley Relay with Hone, **Nicole Holly** and Boeger.

Most of these swimmers should be returning for the 2014 season.

Earning team points may be a problem in the diving events this season. **Chloe Hacker** became a familiar name among Arizona divers, winning the state championship both her freshman and sophomore years.

She has since graduated, and hopefully there is someone waiting in the wings to take her place for Corona on the podium this fall.

**Andrew Tate** qualified at state last year for diving on the boys team, as did **Nicholas Quon** in both the 100 Yard Backstroke and the 200 Yard IM.

Tryouts and practice for these sports usually start the first day of school or before, with games and meets by the second to third week of school.

virtual field trips will be based on nearly 4 billion years of Earth's geological record.

These immersive, interactive VFTs will take students to locations that teach key insights into Earth's evolution, fundamental principles of geology, and practices of scientific inquiry.

Anbar helped lead a multi-institutional team that developed a number of such VFTs for use in Habitable Worlds and elsewhere ([vft.asu.edu](http://vft.asu.edu)), supported by the NASA Astrobiology Institute and the National Science Foundation.

Now, working with ASU education technologist and doctoral student Geoffrey Bruce, ASU professor and geoscience education specialist Steven Semken, and partners at other institutions, Anbar will build virtual field trips covering the sweep of Earth history.

"This rather large undertaking requires a team," Anbar said. "I may be the leader of the band but I sure don't play all the instruments. I am fortunate to have found such great talent."

He and his team will take students to some of the most important places on Earth to explore how the planet came to be what it is today.

"The goal is to develop powerful and engaging new tools to teach about Earth's evolution," explains Anbar.

"In the near term, we will create VFT-based lessons that can be incorporated into existing introductory geoscience courses.

"Right away, that can impact the roughly 2,000 majors and non-majors who take such courses each year at ASU, as well as thousands of students elsewhere. In the long run we aim to create a fully online course like Habitable Worlds – I'm calling it Evolving World for now—that covers the content of one of the most important introductory geoscience courses, historical geology."

Anbar's plan could re-invigorate instruction in historical geology, which is taught in nearly every geoscience program.

In addition to being fundamental to the field of geology, it provides vital context for the search for life beyond Earth, and for the changes that humans are causing to the planet.

However, historical geology is best taught through field experiences, which are logistically challenging at large universities.

Even when they are possible, it is impossible to expose students to all the most scientifically important sites because they are scattered around the globe.

While VFTs cannot rival physical field trips, they are a big advance over teaching this material only through lectures.

"Most science classes teach science as facts and answers," says Anbar.

"With VFTs, as with Habitable Worlds, we are trying to teach that science is really a process – a process of exploration that helps us first organize our ignorance about questions to which we don't have answers, and then helps us narrow the uncertainties so that we can replace ignorance with understanding."



# The Last Word

## Why the sudden increase in panhandler sightings?

Many residents have noticed the increase in panhandlers throughout our community and are wondering what can be done about this issue.

Indeed, individuals and families begging for money have been reported at numerous sites, including entrances and exits of freeways and shopping centers.

While this practice is currently legal, it is not necessarily ethical. Residents need to realize that handing out money at street corners is not a

solution.

The timing of this practice coincides with a federal court's ruling, brought forward by the American Civil Liberties Union, against an Arizona law aimed at prohibiting panhandling. The state law was found to be unconstitutional because it infringed on the right of free speech, as prescribed in the First Amendment.

Therefore, beggars are allowed on public property as long as they don't commit any illegal acts.

With that said, the Chandler Police Department is working with the Arizona Department of Transportation to add "No Trespassing" signage to freeway on- and off-ramps, and private property owners can ask that "No Trespassing" be enforced on their property.

Additionally, the city of Chandler has been proactive in the past few years regarding homeless issues, and

city staff has developed successful collaborations with various agencies to address these needs.

Homeless advocates have approached panhandlers in an attempt to connect them with services. Most of the time, there does not appear to be any interest in receiving assistance, and in some cases, individuals have stated they are not homeless.

Chandler police check on individuals, particularly when children are present. Officers assess health and safety concerns and determine if any laws are violated. They can also provide referrals for services, including food banks, shelters, medical treatment and more.

As mentioned, several advocacy groups and non-profit organizations are dedicated to assisting people in need, especially those who are homeless or on the brink of homelessness. It is much better to support these efforts than to give money to random individuals.

Throughout Maricopa County, Valley of the Sun United Way coordinates a strong homeless initiative referred to as Project Connect. It is a one-stop service that takes place at different locations each month. Project Connect mobilizes local businesses, elected officials, faith-based organizations and diverse

partners to serve those experiencing homelessness, in an effort to provide short and long term solutions.

Locally, Chandler has also implemented a temporary housing solution by offering shelter several nights per week at various church facilities. The program is referred to as I-Help, Interfaith Homeless Emergency Lodging Program. Individuals in need are provided with shelter, meals and access to resources.

Homeless veterans receive even more services. Specific programs are dedicated to locating and assisting them.

Unfortunately, as long as people continue to give cash to panhandlers, they will see begging as a lucrative endeavor and will increase their visibility in our city.

Instead, residents wishing to help are encouraged to support established programs that serve those in need. Donating to faith organizations, non-profit and advocacy groups is not only tax deductible but it ensures that funds are used for the benefit of those who truly need it.
