

Kyrene schools developing ways to counteract out-of-district migration Governing board questions recent drop in enrollment

School choice allows parents the freedom to select the best learning environment for their children.

It also may be one reason behind an enrollment drop in the Kyrene district as more parents opt to send students to charter or private schools, said Dr. Gina Taylor, assistant superintendent, during a presentation to the governing board.

In grades K-5, enrollment dropped 87 students for a total of 11,043 in 2013. A more significant drop was shown in grades 6-8, which fell 420 students for an enrollment total of 17,149 in 2013.

While not a significant number overall, the enrollment decline does concern some board members.

Michelle Hirsch was Kyrene's board president during the study period and said she would like more analysis of this data to learn "the whys" behind the drop in enrollment.

"We have great student achievement in Kyrene—the district just earned an overall A rating by the Arizona Department of Education—so we need to focus our efforts on learning from families why they

are choosing other educational options."

Kyrene is not alone. Overall K-12 enrollment has declined for schools all over the state—Tempe Elementary lost approximately 1,300 students over the past decade.

Completing informal surveys is one technique Kyrene uses to understand the reasons behind families leaving the district.

"Sometimes, families need to move away from the district, which is understandable. But we want to know if there are programs or other changes that the district needs to address," said Kelly Alexander, director of community education and outreach services.

"We plan to use exit interviews more often, if possible. And, more analysis is taking place of our enrollment numbers and the many variables and factors that affect it."

Faced with more competition for students and the state funding that comes with enrollment, many districts also create a marketing plan. Kyrene has used marketing techniques in the past, such as ads in publications, direct mail, school tours, community meetings, the district Website and social media.

"We've even served as a campaign sponsor on the PBS station Channel 8, which allowed us to get out Kyrene's message," said Alexander.

But the enrollment change may spark an even more pro-active approach.

"We are in the midst of reviewing our marketing plan to boost outreach efforts to reach prospective families," said Alexander.

Even with the shifts in enrollment, Kyrene still has a great story to tell, she says.

"We plan to focus on some key points of pride for the district as we continue our marketing across the Valley."

According to the district, these include:


- AIMS scores that exceed the state average in reading, science and math;
- A fully implemented Common Core curriculum to increase college and career readiness;
- A well-rounded education that includes art, music, library and P.E.;
- Dual language, leadership and Traditional Academy offerings; and
- Middle-school electives in Spanish, fine arts, multi-media, theater, band, chorus and orchestra.

Book helps Tempe celebrate its journey to achieve diversity

It seems fitting that as America celebrates the 50th anniversary of the March on Washington that the Tempe History Museum introduces a new book about African-American history in Tempe.

In his book "The African American Experience in Tempe," Jared Smith, history curator for Tempe History Museum, explored the journey of African-Americans in Tempe from the earliest days of the community until now.

The book traces the hardships faced by African-Americans in the late 1890s and early 1900s and shows Tempe's progression as a diverse and welcoming society.

It tells the stories of Buffalo soldiers, railroad workers, barbers, athletes, college students, World War II veterans, blacksmiths, musicians and the everyday people of the time.

The book is filled with photos of Tempe from 1890s through present day. Also featured are visits by Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and President Barack Obama, as well as an interview with Corey Woods, Tempe's first African-American City Council member.

Smith's book is a publication of the Tempe History Museum and its African American Advisory Committee.

It was published with a grant from Arizona Humanities Council. Tempe was not always a welcoming place for African Americans.


The Ku Klux Klan had a presence in Tempe in the 1920s, and Tempe was considered a "sundown town" for African Americans as recently as

60 years ago, meaning that African Americans were not welcome in the city after sundown.

"From struggle to acceptance, the stories and accounts in this book tell the history of the African American experience in our community," Woods said.

"I'm excited about the book release and look forward to moderating the panel discussion."

Those interested in receiving a copy of the free book were invited to visit the museum at 7 p.m. on Sept. 5 to attend a forum about Tempe's African American history. Members of the African American Advisory Committee, which helped collect and preserve the history for the benefit of society, were due to participate. Woods planned to facilitate the discussion.

Inspiration grows from desire to help those in desperate need

Lori Barmore had what's typically known as a normal life—nice house in Chandler, good job, great family—but she was missing something. Inspiration.

So she quit her job and went after a career she'd wanted to do her entire life, nursing, to be there for those in need.

After 10 years of being a Level 1 ICU/trauma nurse, however, Barmore wanted to reach out to those who needed her more. Earlier this year she went on a mission trip to Haiti with friend and coworker Dawn Mougel.

It was on this venture that she and Mougel realized they needed to find a better way to get themselves and others into areas like this where they could help the most.

Barmore began to look into organizations such as Doctors Without Borders, but it would still cost her too much to be able to go on missions. So she and Mougel co-founded Inspire 2 Heal, a non-profit whose main goal is making something as inspirational as helping the less fortunate more obtainable for those wanting to help.

For any normal person wanting to get up and help others, the expense can be prohibitive. A plane ticket alone could cost upwards of \$1,000. Expenses like that compound when the time needed away from work is factored in.

Volunteers still need to put forth some of their own finances, about

\$500, but Inspire 2 Heal is meant to cover the rest, leaving the bill a fourth of what it could be.

Everything about Inspire 2 Heal is, to put it simply, inspiring.

Because it is such a new organization a lot of the work is done out of Barmore's home and after work. "(Inspire 2 Heal's) phone is my cell phone," she remarked proudly.

When Barmore started a non-profit, she meant the non-profit part. Running the organization out of her home allows Inspire 2 Heal to put all donations toward sending people where they are needed. All the work is done by people who want to help and expect no compensation. She already has her group's first two missions planned, one to Guatemala in October, where she has been once before, another to Haiti in January, where she first hatched the idea for the organization. The group for Guatemala is a mix of 15 doctors and nurses who will perform various surgeries that here would be classified as routine but there are life altering.

On a previous mission Barmore met Frankie, who was born with hydrocephalus, or fluid on his brain. Here he would have had this treated, but because he went without treatment until he was 3 there really isn't much that can be done, Barmore says.

It is Inspire 2 Heal's goal to connect people like Frankie, who need help, and people like Barmore, who wants so badly to give it.

Corona's swim and dive team has 63 swimmers and five divers poised to make a splash against some new competition this season after the AIA made some changes in the section schedules.





this season are Hamilton, Basha, Marcos de Niza and Chandler. Leading the competition against these schools in several events should be swimmers **Nicole Holly, Karilyn Quon, Nick Quon, Ericka Boeger, Liliane Stewart, Andy Zhou, Simon Werkhoven, Annie DeLorenzi, and Axel Floyd** and divers **Chloe Hacker** and **Andrew Tate**.

The girls team, hoping to improve over their 22nd finish last season at the Division I state meet, has two swimmers who should lead the way: Holly and Karilyn Quon.

Holly's main event is the butterfly where she is expected to be competitive against her opponents this year. Last season she qualified, as a sophomore, for the state meet in the 100 yard butterfly, finishing in 28th place.

"Nicole is a 'gamer!' She is one of the most competitive athletes on our team," said Musgrave.

Multi-talented **Karilyn Quon** should qualify for the state meet in several events this season and therefore will need to evaluate her options before making the decision on which events to choose, according to Musgrave. She is currently training to compete in the 500 freestyle, 100 breaststroke, 200 IM, 200 freestyle and 100 freestyle.

As only a freshman last season, Karilyn qualified to swim in three events at state: The 200 IM where she finished 10th, the 500 yard freestyle, where she finished 20th and the 200 yard medley relay team of **Amy Hong, Myah Kamani, Holly and Quon** that placed 15th.

Karilyn's older brother, **Nick Quon**, will anchor Corona's boys team that finished 21st at state last season. Nick will compete in a multitude of events too, including the 100 butterfly, 100 backstroke, 200 IM and at least two relay events, picking up from where he left off last season.

Nick competed in two individual and two relay events last season at state. He finished 12th in the 100 yard backstroke and 18th in the 200 IM and finished as high as 12th in the 400 freestyle relay with teammate **Trace**

Langely.

Langely, who was expected to be key to the success of this season's team and had plans to possibly swim for a small college next year after graduating, was sidelined due to injury.

"A sentimental and key loss to our team was losing Trace Langely his senior year to hip surgery," said Musgrave. "His leadership skills, positive attitude and swimming abilities will be greatly missed this year."

Also expected to have an impact this season and qualify for state in the 100 yard breaststroke event are Zhou, Werkhoven and Floyd, according to Musgrave.

Corona's dive team has a new coach, **Mike**

Floyd, who took over after long-time dive coach **Lije Arnold** retired this past year.

"Mike is new to our team, but not new to the sport," said Musgrave. "We needed a quality

coach to help two-time state champ Chloe Hacker, and we got our man."

Corona's dive team is happy to have a healthy Chloe Hacker back on the team and determined to win her third state championship. After dominating the sport and placing first in every regular meet all season long, an injury suffered in practice and not healed by the state meet may have been a contributing factor to her 4th place finish last season.

Hacker, who had been working on some new dives during the summer while she competed at both the junior and senior levels during the club season, is being highly recruited by several D1 colleges including Columbia, Yale, University of Denver, Brown and the U.S. Naval Academy.

"I am really looking forward to my final season at Corona and the amazing recruiting trips I have planned," said Hacker.

"We have a lot of new faces on the team so only time will tell how strong



we are as a team. This will be the fourth season the other senior diver, Andrew Tate, and I have competed for Corona. It should be a good one.”

Coach Musgrave is hoping that what the team chose as its motto this season and what he has seen the first few weeks of practice will continue to be the focus: Team Unity.

The Aztecs start the season with two home meets. First against Hamilton Sept. 10 and then Basha Sept. 12 at the Nozomi Aquatic Center at 250 S. Kyrene Road in Chandler. They then will compete against Marcos de Niza at the McClintock pool on Sept. 19 before traveling to the Wolves Swim Invitational Sept. 21. All meets start at 4 p.m.

Corona badminton

Corona’s badminton team is hoping that a new head coach and a former Corona player assistant coach will help the team develop and grow so that in the next year or two they can be in contention to win another state championship.

Corona won the 5A state championship in 2008 and was runner up in 2007. Since 2008 the Lady Aztecs have had several coaching changes and have struggled to go far in the state playoffs.

Megan Knight, the new head coach, envisions this year as one of transition with a lot of fluctuations on the roster due to all the young players on the team.

“I’m excited to start playing and getting the new girls competing in matches,” said Knight. “We are looking for the team to grow as a whole and expand their skill set for the upcoming years.”

Even though Knight has 12 returning players from the previous season—the team only has two starters from last season—she feels the team, as a whole, has a good foundation to work from and that there is a lot of motivation and drive within each girl on the team.

“I’ll be counting on seniors **Hannah Gur-Arie, Dani Papala, Ariana Zahedi** and **Anna Stadmiller** to be a primary source of leadership for

our young team,” said Knight. “Plus I will have the help of a former Corona badminton player, **Alexis Emerson**, as my assistant coach.”

Even though most of the players are young, one junior stands out for Knight. “**Brittany Fielden** is a huge power player on the team and we are expecting a lot from her this year,” said Knight. “She is already a fantastic player that has so much more potential.”

In addition to Fielden, incoming freshman **Riya Kalra** has caught Knight’s attention.

“Riya is intended to be a starter this year which is a great advantage for Corona,” said Knight. “In addition, returners **Colleen Ridge** and **Marin**

Ridge, twin sisters, will play varsity this season and are expected to do very well.



Escape plan can be key to surviving fire

It's a theme rescue teams say they never can overstress: Fire can strike at any moment, often at the most unexpected times. That's why it is important to have an escape plan.

Tempe Fire officials offer a few simple steps that can be taken to be prepared for an evacuation:

Plan your escape, be prepared, get out and stay out.

"Having an escape plan does save lives," said John Valenzuela, Tempe assistant chief for fire prevention and public education.

"All too often we see people scrambling at a fire scene frantically trying to find loved ones. This could easily be avoided by having an escape plan and practicing it."

- Draw a floor-plan of your home, marking two ways out of every room.
- Agree on a meeting place outside your home where every member of the household will gather.

- Practice the escape plan at least twice a year, and pretend that some of the exits are blocked and that the lights are out.

- Make sure everyone in the household can unlock all doors and windows, even in the dark.

- If you live in an apartment building,

use the stairs. Never use the elevator during a fire.

- Make special arrangements for children, older adults and people with disabilities.

- Install smoke alarms outside every sleeping area and on every level of your home. Be sure to test your smoke alarms monthly and change the batteries at least once a year.

- Replace your smoke alarms every 10 years.

- In case of fire, don't stop for anything.

If you encounter smoke when using your primary exit, use an alternate escape route.

If you must exit through smoke, crawl on your hands and knees.

- Doors need to be tested before opening them. Use the back of your hand to see if the door is warm. If it is, use another escape route.

- If you are trapped, close all doors between you and the fire. Stuff the cracks around the doors with clothes or towels to keep out smoke. Wait at a window and signal for help with a light-colored cloth or a flashlight.

- Once you are out, stay out. Don't go back inside for any reason. If people or pets are trapped, the firefighters have the best chance of rescuing them.

Community art

First neighborhood installation could expand city-wide

During September, four new art pieces will be installed in traffic calming islands in one Tempe neighborhood, thanks to efforts of the Tempe Bicycle Action Group.

The success of the initiative, say planners, could lead to similar projects in other parts of the city.

The organization hired the local art and architecture team coLAB Studio LLC, led by Matthew Salenger, to create bicycle-themed artwork to complement the Mitchell Park East/West Traffic Calming Project completed in 2010.

With a \$15,000 budget, TBAG procured the public art pieces to reflect the group's commitment to bicycling. These unique pieces contribute to the culture and vibe of the city.

"The purpose of the project is to integrate public art with transportation and traffic calming in order to create a more bike friendly environment and establish a strong sense of place," said Eric Iwersen,

city of Tempe interim transportation planning manager.

The art pieces consist of large granite boulders placed in the traffic calming islands that have steel sculptures of bicyclists mounted onto natural stones. Each bicyclist depicted demonstrates a different style of bike. The artwork will be experienced by pedestrians, bicyclists, Orbit transit riders and other users along Farmer Avenue.

"It's great to see this project come to fruition. The art speaks to an ever growing population of Tempe residents dedicated to sustainability and cycling," said Mark Tauber, TBAG president. "Tempe Bicycle Action Group looks forward to more projects like this in Tempe neighborhoods."

Mitchell Park East/West is west of downtown Tempe and is among Tempe's oldest neighborhoods, characterized by an eclectic mix of residents. Farmer Avenue has been identified as a transportation corridor with high volumes of pedestrians, skaters, an Orbit bus route and bicyclists.

About the Mitchell Park East/West Project: To help ensure that residents would be able to get around their neighborhood easily and safely by bicycle, bus or walking while reducing high-speed, cut-through traffic and vehicle emissions, the Mitchell Park East/West project was implemented.

The project includes traffic circles, chicanes and other traffic calming measures. It was completed in 2010 at a cost of \$500,000.



lifetime. A delicate balancing act exists between education and fun—a balance that has been defined and redefined by schools for years.

In order to adapt and respond to the changing lifestyles, the Kyrene and Tempe school districts have introduced a program through Kid Zone integrating science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) in a fun, unique learning environment devoid of the typical pressure children feel in a standard classroom.

Kid Zone offers children a safe place to be when they are not in class, either before or after school.

Kid Zone has always worked hard toward implementing various programs to engage the children in learning and interacting with one another. This is the first year that the STEM program has been officially introduced to the Kyrene and Tempe school districts.

“Our program started with science in general for the past couple of years,” said Jeremy King, community services supervisor for the Kid Zone enrichment program. “As the STEM movement started to progress, we realized that science is just one portion of it—technology, engineering and math all play into it as well.”

Kyrene de las Manitas is the main location for STEM, and the program provides mobile kits to 17 different schools, five in the Kyrene district, 12 in the Tempe district.

Along with King, the members of the Manitas Kid

Zone team are Site Coordinator Michelle Arnieri; Assistant Program Manager Jon Bell; activity leader Tytre West; and science instructor Alex Frazier.

King, who has worked with Kid Zone for nearly 15 years, dedicated his time and efforts towards writing the grant for the site.

“I was thinking when I was writing the grant that it shouldn’t be the only site for the program because it doesn’t benefit the 3,000 kids that we serve on a yearly basis,” King said.

“We want all the kids to be able to experience STEM as well. It was important to me that the program was not only designed for gifted students but for everyone.”

The STEM program includes various activities such as tablets with interactive science applications, microscopes, a snap circuit to build various devices, a living laboratory in the classroom with fish (which the kids named Cherry and Blueberry) and hermit crabs, indoor plants to study growth, and other science- and engineering-related activities.

There is also a science instructor who teaches lessons three days a week along with special science projects each week to look forward to. All of the ideas introduced in the classroom are a result of the staff collaborating to brainstorm ideas for activities.

King and other Kid Zone team members decided it was time to reinvent their program and the way they approach teaching science to successfully engage the students in an enjoyable learning environment.

“We don’t want to be the same science-type classroom where you memorize things. We want to emphasize the program as being experimental in order for the kids to gain a deeper understanding of the way things work,” King said.

This accelerated program encourages children to think critically about science and possibly consider becoming a scientist or engineer in the future.

“I always think about all the things that have helped to make our country in general great, such as the Internet and cars, which were all created by someone to propel us forward,” King said.

“So when I hear that all these scientists and engineers are overseas it just made me think that we need a place where our children not only learn about it but become interested in it and seriously find excitement in it.”

The program is a big step for Kid Zone, and an overall huge movement in education, King says. Kid Zone’s STEM program is highly flexible, working around parents’ schedules to allow them to bring their children as many times a week as they need.

The accelerated program allows children of all age groups and abilities an opportunity to push forward and experience science in a compelling way, all the while efficiently being guided by an enthusiastic Kid Zone instructor. The STEM program was introduced to Manitas on Aug. 5, and the Kid Zone team has quickly noticed the positive impact and high level of interest from the kids.

King says the kids often voice rave reviews, noting that it is their favorite part of the day.

Two thumbs up indeed.

The STEM program has potential to grow and expand further, and everyone involved—Kid Zone instructors, teachers, parents and kids—could not be more excited about its unwritten, optimistic future.

“Kids have a view of the world that we kind of forget sometimes and they will bring it right to the

As in 1812, the British seem to have re-invaded the States—but this time they've targeted our multiplexes. In the last couple of weeks, several movies from, by or about Brits have landed in wide Yank release.

Here are two:

The World's End—The third entry in the “Cornetto trilogy” of comedies written by Simon Pegg and Edgar Wright, directed by Wright and starring Pegg and Nick Frost has arrived. The first, 2004's *Shaun of the Dead*, is a classic both of the zombie genre and of Brit comedy; the second, the 2007 cop-movie spoof *Hot Fuzz*, started out even more brilliantly than *Shaun* but ran out of steam toward the end.

World's End resides somewhere between the two—not quite the homerun of *Shaun*, but ultimately more satisfying *Hot Fuzz*. The main character is Gary King (Pegg) who is trying to reunite four old school friends (Frost, Paddy Considine, Martin Freeman and Eddie Marsan) to have another go at a legendary but unfinished pub crawl from 1990 in their hometown of Newtown Haven, whose major claim to fame is that it's home to Britain's oldest roundabout.

Gary's a scruffy loser who never grew up, while the other four have moved on to relatively mature lives—and one, Andie (Frost) bears Gary a bitter grudge. Nonetheless, all four of his friends show up for the 12-pub crawl, their sights set to finish with a pint at the pub called *The World's End*.


This middle-aged outing alone might have provided enough laughs for a movie by itself, whipped forward by the snappy comic punctuation of Wright's editing.

But about midpoint, *The World's End* suddenly takes a strange sci-fi twist, as the lads realize that something has changed in Newtown Haven.

Really, it's just roughly the zillionth variation on *Invasion of the Body Snatchers*, but it's an amusing one, and the motivation of the invaders links up thematically with Gary's personality. As with *Hot Fuzz*, the movie is a little overambitious—it goes on a smidge too long, and not every scene works.

But there are plenty of laughs, and a few touching moments, and the performances are fine, especially by the feisty, fed-up Frost.

It should also be noted that the final decision of the aliens with regard to humanity—pronounced by Bill Nighy as the voice of “The Network”—is basically the same as that of *The Pods* in Jack Finney's original

San Marcos up for new lease

One of the Valley's most historic icons will be available for commercial lease for the first time in more than 15 years, according to Teri Killgore, downtown redevelopment manager for the city of Chandler.

San Marcos Resort opened in 1913 to much fanfare, serving as a playground for the rich and famous.

With Arizona's first grass golf course, it played host to the likes of Frank Lloyd Wright, Errol Flynn and other luminaries. In the 1970s the San Marcos transformed itself into a hip destination, again drawing Hollywood elite.

"This is a rare opportunity for businesses looking to enter this market," said Killgore, noting the property's longtime appeal.

"It doesn't get much more unique than a historic speakeasy, or 7,000 square feet

on the first floor, so I can't wait to see what comes to fruition."

The resort is undergoing a multi-million-dollar renovation to its hotel and meeting space to create a modern property with nods to its historic roots.

The work is expected to be completed this fall in time for the resort's 100th Anniversary.

The owner is open to subdivision of the space, and is leasing 7,068 square feet of first-floor space, as well as the 2,800-square-foot historic speakeasy space in the basement. The location is near the popular San Tan Brewery, surrounded by free parking and steady walk-by traffic.

High school override enlists a who's-who of backers at kick-off gala

Editor's note: Backers of two school-district overrides have ramped up their campaigns to draw attention to a pair of November ballot measures. Tempe Union staged a personality-studded launch party at Tempe Center for the Arts, while Kyrene planners plan to kick off their efforts later this month at a party planned for the new west Chandler Naber's location. Coverage of that event will appear in an upcoming issue of Wrangler News.

Community leadership is behind an aggressive outreach effort in support of a ballot measure on Nov. 5 to benefit the Tempe Union High School District.

The ballot measure extends the existing budget override for TUHSD and authorizes a bond sale, but will not increase taxes or spending.

Voters will be asked in November to approve continuation of the current 10 percent Maintenance and Operation Budget Override and to allow the sale of \$75 million in general obligation bonds for facility issues.

After a defeat in the last election in 2012,

businesses, parents, administrators, teachers and even students joined forces to educate the public on the need for the approval of the bond money to fund the Tempe district, which serves nearly 14,000.

If defeated, planners say, the loss of override funds will result in a decrease of nearly \$7 million, which pays for instructional programs, staffing to reduce class sizes, after-school, athletic and extra-curricular programs, and facilities maintenance.

The supporters, who have dubbed themselves “Yes Support Our Schools” (YSOS), hosted a fundraiser reception on Thursday, Aug. 22 at Tempe Center of the Arts. The group also has created a Website, <http://yessupportourschools.org>
Community leader and education advocate

Dick Foreman serves as co-chair of YSOS. In his view, “A yes vote for the override budget and bond sale will provide immediate and positive benefits to TUHSD.”

Rosalie Hirano is the parent of 6th and 8th graders now in the Kyrene district and who will attend Corona in the future. She received an invitation to participate in the Citizens Finance Committee for the Tempe District last April.

“Then I became part of a group who recommended to the TUHSD Governing Board that we take the continuation of the override out to the voters,” said Hirano.

“As a parent and homeowner, it is very important to me to maintain the level of funding in the district, especially when it does not mean an increase in property taxes.”

Budget overrides for Arizona school districts must be renewed every five years. If not renewed by public vote, overrides begin a phase down with a complete elimination after several years.

The existing override for TUHSD is scheduled to begin phasing down starting in 2014-15, unless renewed by voters this year.

TUHSD earned an A rating this year from the Arizona Department of Education. The district leads all other Arizona school districts in producing 49 National Merit Scholarship Finalists.

The Tempe Union Class of 2013 had five Flinn Scholars, which is also more than any other district in Arizona. In the past five years, Tempe Union educated a total of 19 Flinn Scholars.

According to the district superintendent, Dr. Kenneth Baca, “The evidence that our students demonstrate excellence in learning is compelling. This past year over half of district students were enrolled in gifted/honors classes, and just over 3,000 students were enrolled in advanced placement courses.

“Also, 2,376 Tempe Union students earned college credits by taking dual enrollment classes, with the potential of graduating high school with an associate degree.”

novel *The Body Snatchers*.

One Direction: This Is Us—The members of the boy band One Direction were assembled in 2010 out of also-ran solo auditioners from the Brit TV talent show *X Factor*. Taken under the wing of none other than Simon Cowell, they failed to win on the show but became wildly popular anyway via social media fandom. As Cowell rather sheepishly notes in this documentary (which he co-produced), the boys became stars before they ever released a record.

The movie, directed by Morgan Spurlock (*Super Size Me*), gives a swift 101 course in the band’s history and a few rather touching glimpses of the boys’ “Mums” and other family members, but principally focuses on life on the road—the genuinely grueling, maybe rather exploitative tour schedule that these lads are kept on.

I can’t keep these guys straight in my head. I can remember the one my kid likes, Zayn (“the mysterious one”). The other four—Harry (“the charming one”), Niall (“the cute one”), Louis (“the

funny one”) and Liam (“the sensible one”; what a bummer as a signature trait!)—just sort of blur together in my mind.

The same goes for their music—cheery, weightless, badly rhymed pop that flatters little girls. A couple of fans astutely observe that One Direction says the things the boys they know never say. But even by boy band standards, it’s thin stuff. To call it “bubble gum” would be to insult the nutritional properties of bubble gum.

All that said, as a movie the fast-paced *One Direction: This Is Us* is pretty watchable. Spurlock mixes tricked-out concert footage with generous helpings of the lads blowing off steam behind the scenes, tussling and roughhousing like the guys in



Seven Brides for Seven Brothers.

Most of them seem to come from working-class backgrounds, and I found it hard not to wish them well, even though the One Direction they’re aimed is, of course, straight at the pocketbooks of little girls.




