This coming Halloween weekend will feature some good scares for a good cause. For the 11th consecutive year, LaNetta and Kevin Leger will stage their Nightmare on Kent Street Haunted House. And each year it makes more of an impact on the community.

The Legers began the haunt as a way to give their Chandler community some excitement and a safe place for kids on Halloween. As the event's popularity grew, the Legers' ambitions increased as well.

Kevin, who works for Intel, heard Henry Salinas speak to employees at the company in 2004. Salinas is the founder of ICAN, a group which provides guidance and activities for the youth of Chandler.

Coming away from the session impressed with Salinas and his efforts, Kevin hatched an idea the very same day. Instead of charging for admission, the haunted house would accept donations and use them to help ICAN.

"That was the first time Kevin had heard of the ICAN program. He was just so impressed and overwhelmed by Henry Salinas' story about how he started ICAN that he knew this was the agency for us," LaNetta said. "This was who we were going to help.

"(Kevin) came home and said 'I found this great organization, helping disadvantaged youth in Chandler. We won't charge people, but let's go ahead and take donations and give it to the agency.' We've been involved with them ever since."

Along with area residents, youth from ICAN now help with the haunt. They help build, act and serve as guides.

"It's just been amazing to watch them grow up or even improve communication skills. They're gaining all these incredible skills and becoming really neat individuals and having a great time in the process," LaNetta said.





Seasonal flu shots part of hospital's disaster-readiness exercise Oct. 31

Chandler Regional Medical Center, with support from the city of Chandler and Maricopa County Department of Public Health, has announced plans to conduct an exercise that tests the ability of county and local agencies to vaccinate a large number of people in the event of a disease outbreak or terrorist attack.

As part of the event, adults over 18 are being invited to walk in for a free seasonal flu shot. It will be the first exercise of such magnitude in the Valley, according to officials.

The walk-up clinic will be conducted from 8 to 11 a.m. Saturday, Oct. 31, at Chandler-Gilbert Community College's Pecos campus, 2626 E. Pecos Road, Chandler.

Similar events have been held at Chandler Regional Medical Center in prior years but with fewer agencies involved and drive-up rather than walk-in public participation.

Vaccinations for H1N1 will not be given during the exercise.

Participants must be 18 or older and do not need to be Chandler residents.

A similar program is being held on the same date at Mercy Gilbert Medical Center, also part of the Catholic Healthcare West hospital network.

Participating in addition to Chandler Regional Medical Center will be the Maricopa County Department of Public Health, Chandler-Gilbert Community College, Maricopa County Sheriff's Office, city of Chandler Fire and Police departments and Community Emergency Response Teams.

In high school sports, a call for moderation

Editorial

At first glance, it appeared that the email to *Wrangler News* sports correspondent Alex Zener was nothing more than a complaint from a father frustrated by the treatment his athlete son had received from a coach at one of our local high schools.

Whether we agreed with the complaint or not, the email got us to thinking about a topic we've heard discussed several times in recent years over the stresses faced by high school athletes who count on sports scholarships to gain college admission.

As graduation nears every spring and the scholarship pursuit escalates, both parent and child sometimes forget one of the important concepts that youth sports is supposed to teach: that commitment to a cause should be a binding contract, to be honored even when it's not in our immediate self interest to do so.

In cases where such dilemmas arise, some dialog between parents and coaches might offer an opportunity to take a deeper look at the relationship between high school sports and the role they play in helping young people to achieve college educations. While high school sports always has been a major door opener for a handful of the athletic elite, that good, old-fashioned academic work ethic consistently proves to be a much more reliable means for kids to generate scholarships.

To retrace the events that brought about our renewed interest in this issue, it seems that a popular member of the high school's varsity football squad, a senior with impressive credentials in both athletics and academics, was cut from the team after telling the coach he planned to miss a game to attend an invitation-only recruiting event at a respected engineering college in the Northwest.

The coach, noting previous warnings about other activities getting in the way of football, removed the player

from that week's lineup and ultimately from the team. The father, of course, was furious, insisting in the email to sports columnist Zener that by his "ridiculously extreme" disciplinary actions, the coach had "destroyed the student's life."

Well, we're not sure about that, since this particular young man appears likely to make it to college and into a productive adulthood even without his high school football coach letting him finish out the season.

Yes, we understand the father's frustration and, naturally, the hope he holds for his son to receive every possible opportunity to advance his future.

We also understand the pressures placed on a coach to build—and hold together—a competitive organization that not only can win next week's game but help the participants learn the lifelong importance of honoring their commitments.

Sure, there are other elements on both sides of this discussion, but the real issue, we think, is a high school sports culture that forces students to make Herculean sacrifices to achieve...what? One of those elusive college athletic scholarships? A future career gilded with perks that mere academic superiority can't provide?

Is it a completely unrealistic hope that both parents and coaches could think about the demands we're placing on our young people and consider moderating some of these pressures?

Maybe somewhere in the negotiations between a kid excited about his future, a dad wanting opportunity for his son and a coach looking out for his team's best interest could have come a little more discussion than what it appears occurred.

For those of us who consider ourselves to be part of an enlightened society, it seems like that shouldn't be too much to ask.

Kids' classic, benefit coming to theater Curtain goes up at Childsplay

No tigers, it seems, but lions and bears (Oh my!) are about to take to the stage at Childsplay.

The resident children's theater company at Tempe Center for the Arts is about to open a full production featuring one of the most famous big cats in all of folklore, and shortly after that, it will host a benefit event featuring couture for bears...of the Teddy variety.

First, the lion: Before the cynics decreed that no good deed goes unpunished, it used to be received wisdom that no good deed went unrewarded.

The classic fable illustrating this was *Androcles and the Lion*, in which the former pulls a thorn out of the paw of the latter. The story has been dramatized numerous times, notably by George Bernard Shaw, but Childsplay's staging of it, which opens on Oct. 31 and runs through Nov. 15, is by acclaimed children's dramatist Aurdand Harris.

The director is Kyrene Corridor

resident D. Scott Withers.

"It's one of the most-produced children's theater plays," says Withers. "It's very high-energy, slapstick comedy, in the style of the Italian *Commedia dell'Arte*."

This is the second directorial effort at Childsplay for Withers, an Idaho native who received his BFA in Theater from ASU in 1989. He also helmed the company's 2008 production of *Alexander and the Terrible, Horrible, No Good, Very Bad Day*.

A veteran of many productions for grown-ups, both as an actor and a director, Withers lists Arthur Miller's *The Crucible* as a dream Childsplay project, noting that it would work for high-school age audiences.

"Most of our shows, even the ones aimed at K-6th grade, work very well for adults," he adds.

Now, on to the bears: At 6 p.m. on Nov. 6, Childsplay hosts "Bear Stage," a benefit for Benjamin's Fund, a charity which provides theater tickets to disadvantaged children.


It's also a memorial, to Benjamin

Volunteers join massive effort to aid world's hungry

What did you do to celebrate World Food Day? If you were one of the 350 volunteers for Operation Sharehouse Phoenix on Oct. 15, you helped pack more than 100,000 meals for people who are hungry throughout the world.

World Food Day is designated worldwide to increase awareness, understanding and information about ways to help people who do not have enough to eat. Every day, more than 16,000 children die from hunger and preventable causes, according to experts.

Operation Sharehouse, with centers in Virginia, West Virginia, North Carolina, Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi and now Arizona, was founded in 2004 in response to the deadliest tsunami in recorded history, killing, injuring or displacing hundreds of thousands in countries bordering the Indian Ocean.

Since the program's inception, more than 45,000 volunteers have packed 17 million meals that have been distributed to hungry people around the world.

Operation Sharehouse Phoenix was a unique opportunity for three non-profit organizations—Food for the Hungry, Stop Hunger Now and Phoenix Rescue Mission—to work together in their commitment to end hunger.

They joined forces with volunteers from churches, schools and organizations around the Valley to package high-protein, dehydrated meals for use in crisis situations and school lunch programs around the world.

"Stop Hunger Now and Food for the Hungry have partnered for years, at times working together to send food to areas hit by disasters," said **Greg Forney**, director of creative services for Food for the Hungry. "The three

organizations realized a partnership would not only effectively fight hunger around the world but also locally in Phoenix."

Stop Hunger Now is based in North Carolina and Food for the Hungry and Phoenix Rescue Mission in the Valley.

Included among the 350 people who volunteered for the Phoenix operation were more than 100 middle school students from south Phoenix; 90 employees from Glynlyon Inc., a Chandler company that provides electronic curriculum to schools; and 60 volunteers from local churches, including East Valley Bible and Bethany Community.

Volunteers not only helped pack the meals but brought boxed cereal and canned goods to benefit Phoenix-based non-profit Phoenix Rescue Mission.

In addition to representative from all three organizations, **Tammy Paz-Combs**, director of the Governor's Division for Community and Youth Development, and **Gena Lee Nolin**, former "Baywatch" TV star and wife of NHL hockey player Cale Hulse, showed up to help the volunteers.

"What a wonderful response to World Food Day to see hundreds of people gathered together from all walks of life, packing more than 100,000 nutritious meals for hungry children around the world," said **Ben Homan**, president of Food for the Hungry.

Operation Sharehouse Phoenix has tentatively scheduled two more packing events within the next couple of months.

"For my husband and I, it's been a great experience getting to know these kids and being able to help them grow and improve, and kind of help them come out of their shell a little bit and work together. It's been really exciting."

While having fun, LaNetta said, the kids are also learning to become leaders.

"The kids coming to help out are learning a lot of skills for their personal lives. Some of them that were very shy and insecure started becoming tour guides and learned how to interact with people," she said.

"Some of these kids now are guest speakers for ICAN. It's amazing to watch them grow up, doing other projects

and really blossoming doing it."

Last year the haunted house raised \$3,500. This year they decided to raise the bar and go for \$4,000.

"It's great. Everybody gets their scares. And for those who are a little too timid to go through the full part of the haunted house, we have a separate seating area by a fire pit where families can come in and for the kids that are too scared to go through the haunt. There's entertainment everywhere. It's an evening for the entire family."

The haunt will take place Oct. 25-31. Nightmare on Kent Street will host a special event for the special-needs community on Oct. 24.

To keep things frightening, the haunt has a different twist every year. This year, said LaNetta, "We've decided to go 3-D."

The haunted house is at 6402 W. Kent Drive, Ray Ranch Estates, and will be open from 6:30-10 p.m.



Chandler Little League signing up now

"In the past, coach pitch included kids from five to eight years old, but now the younger kids will be able to play T-Ball, making our coach pitch division more of a stepping stone to advance to the minor league."



Mark Salem knew he would have to intervene. "See that foot?" he said. "I know I'm going to have to pull that foot and pull that baby out."

The next photo shows a foal in a placenta bag.

"I tear the bag and shake the baby's face, and the baby starts to breathe," Salem said.

Using a series of photos on his computer of his horse Cowgirl giving

birth, Salem graphically demonstrates the difference between being a "country kid" and a "city kid."

Though he lives near the developed area of Warner Road and Priest Drive, he most definitely is a "country kid" at heart.

Salem owns six acres of ranch property in the Kyrene Corridor and breeds and boards horses, maintaining a vestige of Tempe's rural past. His

property sticks out to passers-by, some of whom pull off the road when they see the regal animals.

He doesn't mind at all if they carry a bag of carrots or apples to feed the horses through the fence, but don't even think about entering the pasture. Those considering it should heed his sign: "Trespassers will be shot, and survivors will be shot again."

Things like this can make him come off as hard-nosed, but Salem is just looking to preserve a sliver of a more relaxed lifestyle amid the hustle and bustle.

"I have kids and grandkids who love coming to Papa's ranch," he said. "We have owls, hawks, gophers, coyotes, horses, mules, donkeys...It's quite a menagerie."

Everything east of Salem's property to Hardy Road was a farm field when he bought it in 2000.

"We used to ride our horses and chase jackrabbits," he said.

Though he admits he was "kind of brokenhearted" when developers bought the land and built "McMansions" on it, he knew it was coming. He bought his land from an old cowboy, Don Owen, and promised him he wouldn't tear down the barn. In fact, Salem renovated it.

Dawn Brockman is glad for Salem's passion. She bought her paint, Mystie, from him and boards her at Salem's ranch.

"Anywhere else that I would put her would be 20 minutes, half an hour away," she said. Also, Brockman added, "She's out in the pasture most of the time instead of being penned up."

Brockman says Salem's ranch is "like a piece of the countryside in the middle of the city. It gives me my sanity. It's a haven for me to go to."

But Salem isn't a nostalgic fool. He's a savvy businessman who also owns Salem Boys auto shop and car wash, Salem Performance Division, a rental car company, a horse breeding firm and a consulting company. He's received "just about every environmental award around here," he said, for his commitment to creating a "green" auto shop.

"We are the only auto repair shop that has ever been recognized by the EPA (Environmental Protection Agency)," he said.

Salem started his shop in 1979 in Ahwatukee as the second business to open in the fledgling community, after Circle K. He moved to Guadalupe and McClintock from 1986 to 1991 and was in a temporary building from 1991-94 before opening his current location on Warner Road.

When he built it, he was determined not to leave the kind of legacy he saw all over the Valley: Gas stations and repair shops being fenced off and declared an "environmental zone" with cleanup costs exceeding the value of the property.

To do that, he recycles about 99 percent of everything, including metals, paper, batteries, oil and coolant. He uses vegetable oil in the underground hoists so there's no contamination if there's a leak. And way before his time, he made sure the building was "green," with high-efficiency energy materials throughout.

He and wife Ranae want to pass their properties to their grown children – Alison, Alan and Andi – and don't want the developments to be a problem for anyone else.

"We couldn't imagine us handing this building over to our kids if it was surrounded by a chain link fence and not fit for humans to come in," he said.

Aztecs dominate former region rival with 27-13 win

Corona beat former Central region foe and geographical neighbor Desert Vista 27-13 under the lights Oct. 16 in a packed Thunder Stadium when quarterback **Chase Cartwright** passed for 142 yards leading to three touchdowns and two field goals from kicker **Dylan Harris**.



What was expected to be a knock-down, drag-out battle for supremacy failed to materialize, with both teams hoping for a playoff spot in the state tournament.

Even though the Aztecs have struggled this year, Corona totally dominated the first half, scoring on all four possessions.

In the first quarter the Aztecs scored 14 unanswered points.

On the opening kickoff, the Aztecs drove for 58 yards in

12 plays before Cartwright's pass to **Kyle Benson** on a fourth and three lead to their first touchdown. With 6:49 left in the first quarter, the Aztecs found themselves up 7-0 after Harris scored the point-after kick.

The defense stuffed the Thunder, not even allowing a first down during Desert Vista's first possession. Corona took a 14-0 lead on their second possession of the game with a 2-yard touchdown run by quarterback Cartwright and the point-after kick

by Harris with 1:24 left in the first quarter.

The Aztecs also controlled all but the very end of the second quarter by scoring on their next two possessions to take a 24-0 lead. Harris put one through the uprights in a 37-yard field goal attempt with 11:06 left in the second quarter to make the score 17-0.

On the Aztecs' next possession, they took nine plays to go 85 yards in 3:23 minutes to score on Cartwright's second touchdown of the game with

a 3-yard run, putting them up 24-0 with 3:57 still left in the first half. The Thunder managed to score a touchdown late in the quarter, making the score 24-7 as the teams headed into the locker rooms for halftime.

The Thunder rallied after halftime to score on a 36-yard touchdown pass from Sean Coffinger to Mike Ing and cut the lead to 24-14 in the final play of the

Tempe Town Lake: A landmark celebrates its 10th year with a birthday bash

Editor's note: It's hard to believe that Tempe Town Lake is already 10 years old.

After more than three decades of visioning, discussion, engineering and planning, two miles of barren Salt River bottom was filled in 1999, removing an eyesore and giving birth to one of Arizona's top tourist attractions, Tempe Town Lake on the Rio Salado.

The investment of time, money and ingenuity was significant—the dividends have been even more so, in terms of financial return, world status, recreation opportunities and environmental sustainability.

This is the first of a four-part look at the impact that Tempe Town Lake has had on this community.

It's odd to think of Tempe Town Lake as a place of peace.

There's Tempe Beach Park, with its festivals, concerts and athletic events. There's Loop 202 on the north side of the lake, one of Arizona's busiest sections of freeway. Trains beep and planes fly overhead. But step away from the roadway and the crowds and you can enter a world that you share with no one but the water and the wildlife.

Tempe Town Lake is not just a recreation area; it is a habitat. Snowy white egrets, great blue heron, even bald eagles fish the waters. More than a dozen varieties of fish swim in the lake. There have been sightings of beaver, turtles, rabbits, even the occasional javelina and coyote. It's a case of "if you build it, they will come."

Part of the funding for Tempe Town Lake came from the Army Corps of Engineers; their mission was to restore the terrain for wildlife by creating habitats at each end of the lake and another in the section of Indian Bend Wash Greenbelt that emptied into Town Lake.

Plants and animals alike thrive in the habitat areas. (see <http://www.tempe.gov/lake/ParksNature.htm> for more information).

They became so popular that a Safe Harbor Agreement was developed with U.S. Fish and Wildlife to protect those animals and the endangered species that were calling the lake home. A person can spend quiet hours watching herons fish, or trying to spot the

endangered Yuma clapper rail.

Fishing is popular, too. Each year, Arizona Game and Fish stock Town Lake with thousands of rainbow trout.

You can visit the lake Nov. 24 for the annual release at Town Lake Marina, 3-5 p.m. Chuck E. Baby and the All Stars will play fishing music while experts teach kids and adults alike the best methods for catching the big ones. Thousands fish Town Lake each year, whiling away the gentle afternoons.


Boating is another method to get away from it all while still in the middle of the city. Town Lake offers boating classes through many clubs as well as through the City of Tempe Parks and Recreation program. www.tempe.gov/boating

If you want to boat on your own, you can. If your boat is wind, electric or manually powered, you can bring it to Tempe Town Lake once you have a permit.

In celebration of Town Lake's 10th birthday, Tempe is hosting a free boating day on Saturday, Nov. 7, the weekend that Town Lake was originally filled. Take your sailboat, kayak or pontoon to the Town Lake Marina and get a free one-day permit.

Free boating day doesn't just apply to people who own boats. Tempe Parks and Recreation will have free kayaks for people to try. Many of the boat clubs that operate at Tempe Town Lake will offer rides and demonstrations to visitors.

Check out the dragon boats, sailboats, outrigger canoes and rowing shells. Arizona Game and Fish will offer boating safety classes. Members of the Coast Guard Auxiliary will teach life jacket (PFD) safety.



Saturday, Nov. 7 Schedule

10 a.m. – 4 p.m. Free kayaking, boating and safety demonstrations

Bring your driver's license or Arizona Identification Card to paddle a kayak on the lake at no charge and take a look at the boating clubs on Town Lake, sign up for Parks and Recreation classes and learn boat safety.

10 a.m. – 6 p.m. Free boating for boat owners

Staff will be ready to issue one-day permits to boats that meet Town Lake guidelines. No gas-powered boats are allowed on Tempe Town Lake – only boats that are manually powered, wind-powered or electric-powered.







three game losing streak before the fall break. The Lady Aztecs also improved on their finish in tournaments this season by not only making it into the Gold Division of the prestigious Goldwater tournament with three of the state's top teams, Xavier, Gilbert and Desert Vista, but by taking fourth out of 32 teams.

The Lady Aztecs are going to have to continue winning, though, if they hope to make it deep or make it at all into the state tournament rapidly approaching because they were ranked—as of Oct. 20—15th in 5A-I power points.

This ranking is behind teams they would not have even considered in the running in past seasons, such as Mesa, Desert Ridge, Alhambra, North, Westwood, Mountain Ridge and Hamilton to name a few.

The task is not going to get any easier when you look at Corona's remaining schedule. The Aztecs should have beat Mesa Mountain View on Oct. 20, and playing Gilbert at home on Oct. 22 will be a battle.

The Lady Aztecs should also take their match against Perry on Oct. 28 but will have another challenge against the Basha Bears on Oct. 29. The good news is that the match will be played on Corona's home court. The bad news may be that Basha beat them 3-1 exactly a month earlier and, as of Oct. 20, sports a 9-2 record and is No. 8 in power points.

Corona's last two games of the regular season may be able to pull them up in the power point rankings in time for the state tournament. The Oct. 3 match at Dobson and the Oct. 5 match against Highland on Corona's court the Lady Aztecs should win since they easily beat both teams earlier in the season 3-0.

The Lady Aztecs will continue to count on senior outside hitters **Bethany Jorgensen**, averaging three kills a game, and **Cassie Rhonda**, with over two kills a game, to provide the offensive power. Middle blocker **Katherine Gatz** has also been adding offensive firepower with close to two kills a game.

Setter **Cassie Fish** has started to feel more in tune with her hitters and has been perfecting her high sets to the outside for the Lady Aztecs big hitters. Fish is currently averaging close to eight assists a game.

On defense, **Haley Kesteloot** leads the Lady Aztecs in digging averaging around three digs a game. Right behind her in this category

is **Jorgensen**, **Rhonda** and **Sidney Lemieux** all averaging more than two digs a game.

The Lady Aztecs have two more home matches before the 5A-I state tournament. Come out and show your support Oct. 29 when they play Basha or on Nov. 5 in their match against Highland.

Corona's JV team finished with an impressive third place out of 12 teams competing at that level when **Michael Seall** crossed the finish line in third place and **Josh Coulter** came in ninth. Rounding out the Aztec runners were **Grant Swenson**, 21st, **Stephen Kuluris**, 27th, **Justin Yang**, 34th and **Jeff Morrison**, 47th, out of 157 finishers.




